SOUTH FARNHAM SCHOOL

South Farnham Primary School consisting of 788 pupils from 4 - 11 years is situated on two sites, one in Menin Way and the other in The Bourne. It is an 'Outstanding' school, a National Teaching School and the Accredited Body for the Surrey South Farnham SCITT. South Farnham is the designated Academy Sponsor.

The Board of Directors of the Trust have delegated certain functions to be locally managed which means that the Local Governing Bodies have general responsibility for the effective management of the school.
